

Summary 5-years Project Report ... and a Christmas wish list

Dear Friends Ministry Partners,

The Moffat Community Health and Development Project (#92163) was renewed for another 5 years starting in January this year (2024). We're off to a great start and are looking forward to four more impactful years.

We have recently produced a summary project report covering the 2019 to 2023 five years project cycle. During the five years, some of the achievements accomplished include:

- More than 100 Moffat students taught a life skills curriculum to over 5000 upper primary students in 18 local schools. In the process, over 1700 primary students made first-time decisions to follow Christ.
- A discipleship training program was launched, prompted by the spiritual needs of so many primary students accepting Christ. We trained 179 disciplers including three police officers in a local "child crime" unit. These are now discipling 1265 young adolescents in their new walk with Christ.
- Local schools in the trucking community of Maai Mahiu have asked our trained disciplers to assist with Christian education classes that are now reaching around 8000 primary students in the area.
- Despite Covid restrictions preventing many planned activities, the project still managed to reach over 14,400 young people with trainings, seminars, and other theme-focused events. Of these, over 1630 received salvation in Jesus Christ.
- Outreach ministries including residential camps and support groups reached 1441 adolescents living with HIV with a combination of healthy living lessons and spiritual nurture. A new support group to help 69 single teen moms who became pregnant during Covid-induced school shutdowns is already transforming lives.
- Two student groups at Moffat are supported by this project. One has visited maximum security prisons, youth detention centers, a school for the blind, several orphan homes, and countless elderly shut-ins bringing living essentials and good news. The other launched a new youth engagement program that is reaching around 300 high school aged adolescents each month. The witness and practical ministries of these student groups have birthed over 100 more souls into Christ's kingdom.
- An adaptation of the new youth engagement program was picked up by a Christian radio station in Kenya. The
  station estimated that the programming was reaching around 15,000 young people with each weekly episode. This
  success has resulted in the launch of a new "media ministry" designed to reach even more young people with
  practical spiritual wisdom and gospel messaging through podcasts and other social media platforms popular with
  Kenyan youth today.

This transformative project is approved by SIM to run through December of 2028, but its current funding will run out by August of 2025. If this happens, it will have to shut down. Too many lives are being positively impacted for Christ to let this happen. We are in desperate need of project partners who will be willing to make either generous one -time gifts to keep it running, or even better to commit to regular contributions to help sustain it on an ongoing basis.
